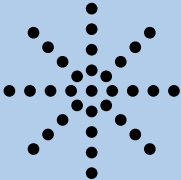

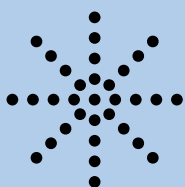

HELPING CHILDREN FIGHT HUNGER

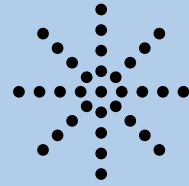
While the year brought unique challenges, our program remained strong, providing meals to almost 1,000 children around the Greater Cincinnati region.

Programs	Details	Outcome
Meal Service	We operated 31 locations around Hamilton and Butler counties serving breakfast, lunch, and take-home meals (weekdays and weekends).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We served 73,332 meals to 974 children; • We increased our take-home meals by 35%!
Academic Enrichment	Our instructors worked with children to focus on improving reading skills for 4 weeks. We developed a more structured curriculum that worked well for our students that needed more intervention.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 86% of students increased their oral reading fluency • 73% of students maintained or increased their reading comprehension scores
Physical Fitness	We encourage our sites to keep kids active daily. We incentivize activity through our annual Fun to Be Fit Day!	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 350 children participated in Fun To Be Fit Day

THE YEAR IN REVIEW



A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

This year we celebrated 20 years of serving children and families in the Greater Cincinnati community. We started with uncertainty, as many non-profits receiving federal funds saw big changes. But even with that uncertainty, God provided even more than we could ask. We continued to not only operate our summer programs all over Hamilton and Butler counties but also welcomed 5 new locations. Our take-home meals increased by 35%, which is the largest amount since the pandemic! In addition, our supporters and funders helped us step up and provide groceries for more than 110 families when food assistance benefits were not available. It was truly a blessing to experience connections and support that allowed us to continue to focus on our mission. We look forward to doing even more in 2026!

A YEAR OF CELEBRATION

In 2025, Whole Again proudly celebrated 20 years of service while continuing to grow in strength and impact. This milestone year marked meaningful expansion in our reach to children across our community, as well as the addition of new members to our Board of Directors and Advisory Council, strengthening our leadership and governance. We were also honored to maintain our Better Business Bureau accreditation, reflecting our ongoing commitment to transparency and accountability.

We met and exceeded our goals across all key focus areas — Nutrition, Education, and Funding. Even amid uncertainty, our mission remained clear. We stayed focused on ensuring children in our community had consistent access to nutritious meals and quality enrichment opportunities.

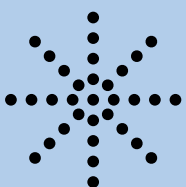

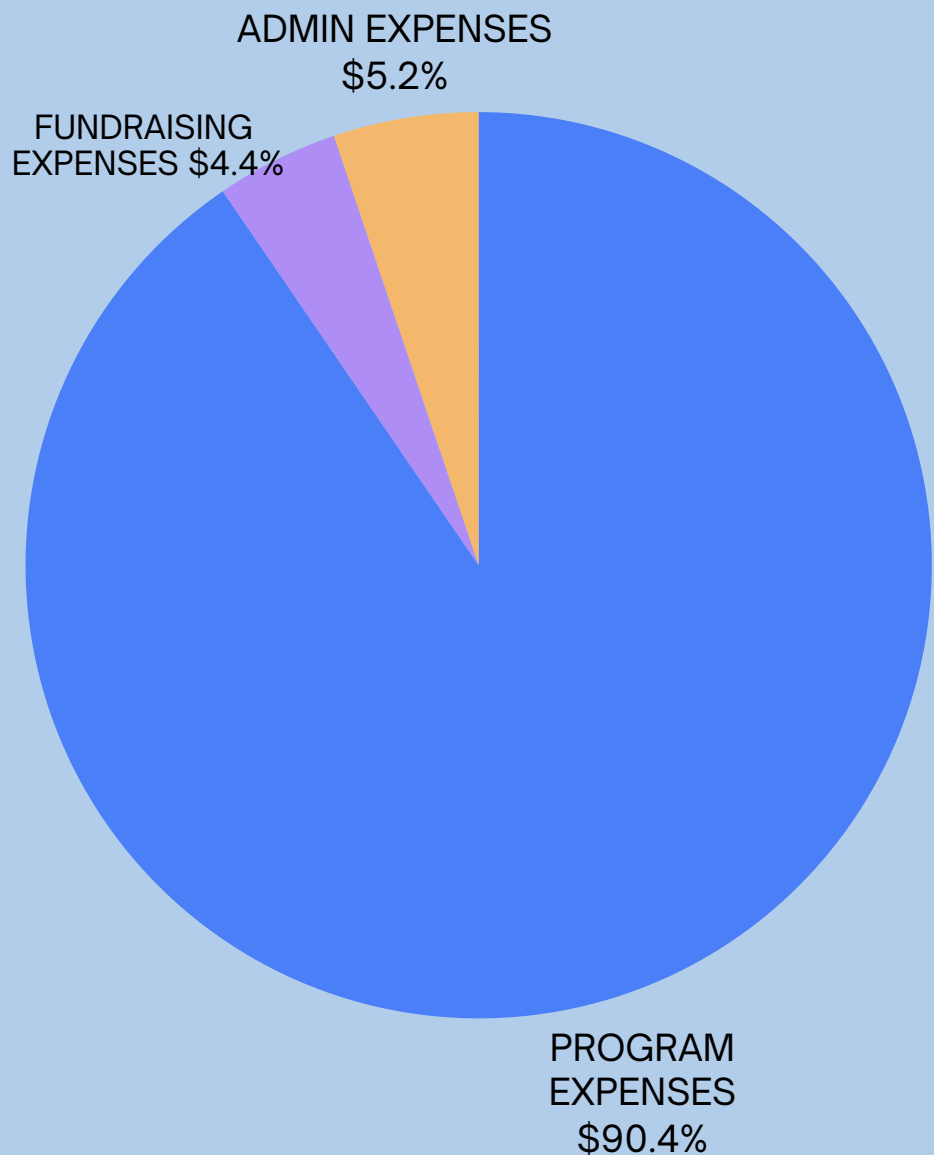
